DAILY SCREENINGS

Symptom self-monitoring will be an expectation of all community members. Members of the campus community will be expected to monitor themselves for symptoms of COVID-19 daily. The College will use the MMC Application to monitor the daily screenings. Screening will occur at administrative building entrances, academic offices and classrooms. Visitors will check-in at the Library.

- **Employees, Students, and Visitors will be screened daily with the following questions using the MMC Application:**

Scan the QR code with your MMC App. if you can answer NO to these questions:

- Are you currently diagnosed or suspected of having COVID-19?
- Have you had a fever above 100.4 in the last 48 hours?
- Have you been in close contact with a confirmed case of COVID-19 in the past 14 days?
- Are you experiencing a cough, shortness of breath, chills, sore throat, muscle pain, or headache?
- Have you had new loss of taste or smell?
- Have you had vomiting or diarrhea in the last 24 hours?

- **Anyone refusing to daily screen or failing to meet any screening standard is not permitted to enter any campus facilities (Main Campus, East Campus, or Maker Lab).**

- o Faculty, staff, & students must fill out a COVID-19 Self-Isolation Form and contact a COVID-19 Coordinator
- o Employees should contact their area Vice President and supervisor.
- o Students should also contact the Clinic, their instructors (or Provost), and coaches and athletic trainers if applicable.
- o Visitors should reschedule visits after 14 days.
(see “if you are sick”)

Random Temperature Screening will occur at all buildings. Screenings will be conducted by security and nursing students.

FACE MASKS

Face masks or coverings (e.g., disposable masks or cloth face coverings) must be worn over your nose and mouth by all staff, faculty, and students on campus when in the presence of others and in public settings (e.g. common workspaces, public spaces, hallways, stairwells, elevators, meeting rooms, classrooms, break-rooms, and restrooms, etc.) and outside when you can't social distance (6ft of separation).

- Disposable masks will be provided in all facilities. Disposable masks may only be worn for 24 hours.
- Exceptions to wearing a face covering:
 - o When you are alone (e.g. residential room, office, or outside),
 - o When you are eating and drinking,
 - o When you are maintaining a social distance of six feet or more from others outside, or
 - o When an instructor is behind a plexiglass barrier in class, the instructor is not required to wear a mask.

- Remember:
 - o Cloth face masks/coverings are not a substitute for social distancing.
 - o You can spread COVID-19 even if you do not feel sick.

 - Accommodations will be made for those unable to wear a face covering for medical reasons.
- * An individual room in a residence hall or apartment will be considered as a private residence under the masking directive, and the students living in that room/apartment/house will be considered part of a “family group.”
